
Project Goal

- Seeks to learn the extent to which confirmation and equivalent practices in the Protestant denominations in North America are effective for strengthening discipleship in youth.
- Outline effective Confirmation Practices from successful Confirmation programs
- Churches from a variety of contexts shared their successes
- Discerned what is working well across all contexts




Major Findings

- Average age 14 years old
- 6 month average duration of a confirmation program
- The program adapted to the local church context
- The program was real and relevant
- Christian foundation for public life
- Importance of relationships over curriculum
- Inquiry based learning
- Importance of pastoral involvement and leadership
- Connection to baptism




BIG God Big Questions is the first denominational curriculum to be developed taking into account the findings from The Confirmation Project.



Big God Big Questions based on Confirmation Project Findings

- Geared at a transition point from middle to high school
- 12 sessions that can be split into 24 sessions
- Based in congregational experience of the user
- Learned in context of church involvement
- Christian tradition and life experience intersect
- Intentional and consistent engagement with parents and mentors
- Asking and answering questions, and asking more questions
- Shared leadership with pastors and lay leaders written with lay leaders in mind
- Based on the baptism and membership questions

The Scope and Sequence

The Questions we are asked when we join the church

- What is a covenantal? What is a covenantal vow?
- What do the questions mean?
- What is being asked of me?
- Am I prepared do answer these questions?
- Am I ready for this milestone in my faith?

1. a covenantal vow

- 2. Who is this God? How is God trustworthy? We learn about God's faithfulness throughout generations.
- 3. We name sin individual, corporate, and systemic and explore ways we as individuals and the church turn from sin and work for justice in the world.

Trusting in the gracious mercy of God, do you turn from the ways of sin and renounce evil and its power in the world?

- 6. What does it mean to follow Christ, and obeying his word, take up your cross?



BIG God BIG Questions


invites the congregation to play an active role in the lives of young people as they explore their faith. asks that each person confirmand, parent or caregiver, leader, mentor, and congregant - takes seriously what is going on in faith formation and the profession of faith.

"high expectation"

recognizes that this is a significant and holy time in the life of all involved. That means that this time is honored.

calls for adults to model what is important to them—their faith, and their questions and their struggles. They show up.

Youth ask for confirmation to be real and relevant and it is up to us to treat it as such.

Provides background info from each session, personal reflections for adults, and prompts and activities to connect with your confirmand.






Video

So What? Now What?


Consider how the study will help confirmands prepare to answer all four Confirmation questions.

- All of these elements work together to enhance the confirmand's exploration of faith and strengthen relationships between the adults in their lives and the confirmands.




BIG Journal

Infographics


