



## The Great Commandment

(based on Mark 12:28–34)

One day, a religious leader came to ask Jesus a question. “Jesus,” he said, “I have a question for you. There are many books full of God’s laws. But what is the most important law?”

This was a tricky question. The law of God had been written down a long time ago. There were hundreds of different laws to remember. No one could agree which one was the most important. Religious leaders had argued about it for many years.

The religious leader was impressed. Jesus had answered the question well. He was a wise and helpful teacher.



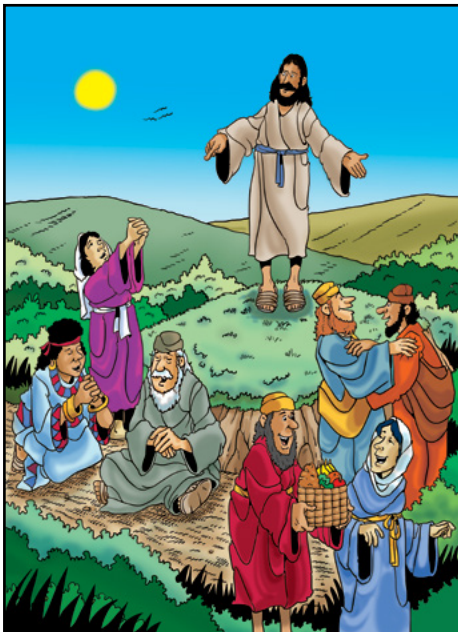
## The Great Commandment

Use one or more activities from each section to explore grace and gratitude with your children this week.

### Recognizing God's Grace

- Read and enjoy the story together—imagine and wonder.
- Wonder together how loving God and loving your neighbor overlap.

### Responding to God's Grace

- Help someone draw a large heart on a sheet of paper. Offer old magazines and have everyone cut out pictures of people to glue on the heart. Write “Love God, Love Neighbor” in the margin.
- Draw pictures of some neighbors to love.
- Make a heart wreath. First, cut the middle out of a paper plate, leaving only the border. Fold a sheet of paper in half. Show how to draw half a heart along the fold of the paper and cut it out to form a heart when unfolded. Let them cut out many hearts in different sizes and colors. Help them arrange the hearts, overlapping them on the paper plate border to form a wreath.

### Celebrating in Gratitude

- Read the four stories from *The Sneeches and Other Stories* by Dr. Seuss (Random House Books for Young Readers, 1961) or watch the YouTube video “The Sneeches and Other Stories” ([bit.ly /4SeussStories](https://bit.ly/4SeussStories), 16:55). Look for themes of diversity, tolerance, and compromise. Talk together about how to be a good neighbor.
- Pray this prayer:

*God, help me to love you with all my heart, soul, and mind, and to love my neighbor as myself. Amen.*
