(based on Luke 2:1-7)

God's Gift of Love

(based on Luke 2:1-7)

Use one or more activities from each section to explore grace and gratitude with your children this week.

Recognizing God's Grace

- Advent wreath—When your family is together for a meal this week, read the Bible story, and light the first, second, and third candles of the wreath. Wonder together where God's grace is in this story.
- Invite everyone to imagine what it was like for Mary and Joseph to get ready for Jesus to be born and to take a long trip. Play a "make-a-list" game by naming something to pack for the baby or something needed for the trip. Try to use every letter in the alphabet.
- Retell the story as a *Las Posadas* play around your home or with neighbors. Identify people to be Mary, Joseph, and two or more innkeepers. Pick a place for Mary and Joseph to begin the journey, several places to stop and ask for a room, and a last stop. As someone narrates, Mary and Joseph go from place to place—knocking, asking, and being told "no." At the last place, the innkeeper will say, "Welcome! There is room here."



Responding to God's Grace

- Sing the following lyrics to the tune of "London Bridge Is Falling Down."

Everywhere they went that night, went that night,
went that night,
everywhere they went that night said, "There's
no room for you."

Celebrating in Gratitude

- In gratitude for shelter and the hospitality of others, find a pattern for making a simple no-sew, fleece baby blanket. Pick out fabric, and make one or more blankets to use at the church or donate to a clinic or hospital nursery.
- Bake a birthday cake for Jesus and share it with your neighbors. Invite everyone to put on party hats and to sing "Happy Birthday" to Jesus.
- Pray the following prayer each day this week:

Dear God, help us share your presence in the world. Amen.
