OPENING SENTENCES

This is the day that the Lord has made.

Let us rejoice and be glad in it.

SCRIPTURE

11:37 While he was speaking, a Pharisee invited him to dine with him, so he went in and took his place at the table. ³⁸The Pharisee was amazed to see that he did not first wash before dinner. ³⁹Then the Lord said to him, "Now you Pharisees clean the outside of the cup and of the dish, but inside you are full of greed and wickedness. ⁴⁰You fools! Did not the one who made the outside make the inside also? ⁴¹So give as alms those things that are within and then everything will be clean for you.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Gracious God, Like the Pharisees, we sometimes congratulate ourselves on meeting the letter of the law, while willfully ignoring the Spirit that animates and inspires it. In one hand, we hold a pinch of cumin, some sprigs of mint, and a bit of crushed dill. In the other hand, all the weighty matters of the law: Justice for vulnerable people denied power. Inequalities that imprison others in systems of poverty and need. Indifference to policies that ignore the lack of access to health and well-being. Forgive our attention to issues of outward appearance even as we ignore our inward failings. Open our eyes, our ears, and our hearts, we pray. Move us past the carefully measured tithes of our smallest platitudes. Galvanize us to heap up our offerings with our best, most creative, most generous efforts to join in God's work. In the name of Jesus, we pray.¹
