Remind the congregation to enfold this child


into their loving arms.

Questions and Answers about Baptism

Q. Just what is baptism?

A. Baptism is a sacrament of the Christian church. In the Protestant and Reformed traditions, baptism is one of two sacraments. The other is Communion, also known as the Eucharist and the Lord's Supper. For these congregations, the sacraments are those instituted by Jesus through his own baptism (Luke 3:21–22) and through his words at the Last Supper, before he was arrested in the garden (22:14–20).

Baptism today is how the church follows Jesus' commission to the disciples to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you" (Matt. 28:19–20). A sacrament is a sign and symbol of God's love and mercy. It is a means of grace, a way that we receive God's love that is freely given, based on nothing that we have done to earn it. In baptism, we begin a new life with Christ.

Q. What happens during a baptism?

A baptism typically has these elements: Presentation of the Baptismal Candidate, Profession of Faith, Thanksgiving over the Water, The Act of Baptism, and Welcome. The ritual for a service of baptism is on pages 10–14. The words may vary from pastor to pastor, but the meaning will be much the same. The pastor asks parents and others present to commit to teach and model the Christian faith for the child and dabs or pours a small amount of water on the child's forehead.

Sometimes children in the congregation are invited to sit near the baptismal font for an infant baptism. They may be asked a question, such as, "Will you be a friend to (*child*) and help him/her learn about Jesus?" Your older children may be invited to stand with you
